PART 1: INVITATION TO TENDER

1 GENERAL

Submissions to this Request for Proposal (RFP) [hereinafter referred to as a Tender or a Proposal] are requested from persons, companies, close corporations or enterprises [hereinafter referred to as an entity, or Tenderer].

South Africa's state-owned Strategic Fuel Fund ("SFF") association has nominated PV-SA Energy Services ("PV-SA") to serve on its behalf as the overall project manager with project management tasks that include all matters relating to the current RFP. As such, queries relating to this RFP and any future project related queries, unless explicitly instructed by SFF, need to be directed to PV-SA using the following email address:

1.1 DESCRIPTION

RFP number SFF/2023/1A/NOESP#3 is for a service provider, to carry out an ESIA referred to as 'Sub-Project#3: ESIA for the Jonglei sub-basin in Block B2, South Sudan'.

1.5 PROPOSAL SUBMISSION

Only online submissions will be accepted.

2.1 Delivery is ONLY via online submission

3 BROAD-BASED BLACK ECONOMIC EMPOWERMENT AND SOCIO-ECONOMIC OBLIGATIONS

SFF Association fully endorses and supports the Government's objective of Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment and it is strongly of the opinion that all South African business enterprises have an equal obligation to redress the imbalances of the past.

3.1 <u>B-BBEE Joint Ventures or Consortiums</u>

Tenderers who would wish to respond to this RFP as a Joint Venture [JV] or consortium with B-BBEE entities, must state their intention to do so in their RFP submission. Such Tenderers must also submit a signed JV or consortium agreement between the parties clearly stating the percentage [%] split of business and the associated responsibilities of each party. If such a JV or consortium agreement is unavailable, the partners must submit confirmation in writing of their intention to enter into a JV or consortium agreement should they be awarded business by SFF association through this RFP process. This written confirmation must clearly indicate the percentage [%] split of business and the responsibilities of each party. In such cases, award of business will only take place once a signed copy of a JV or consortium agreement is submitted to SFF Association.



3.2 <u>Preference Points and Specific Goals</u>

As prescribed in terms of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act (PPPFA), Act 5 of 2000 and Preferential Procurement Regulations 2022, Tenderers are to note that the following preference point systems:

- the 80/20 system for requirements with a Rand value of up to R50,000,000 (all applicable taxes included) OR
- the 90/10 system for requirements with a Rand value above R50,000,000 (all applicable taxes included)

When SFF association invites prospective Service Providers to submit Proposals for its Specific Goals, it requires Tenderers to complete Annexure A [the B-BBEE Preference Point Claim Form] and submit it together with proof of their documents as stipulated in the Claim Form in order to obtain Specific Goal Points.

Note: Failure to submit a valid and certified copy B-BBEE certificate or Sworn Affidavit or any other documents specified (as evidence for Specific Goals) at the Closing Date of this RFP will result in a score of zero being allocated for Specific Goals.

3.3 Subcontracting

SFF association fully endorses Government's transformation and empowerment objectives and when contemplating subcontracting. Tenderers are requested to give preference to companies which are Black Owned, Black Women Owned, Black Youth Owned, owned by Black People with Disabilities, EMEs and QSEs.

In terms of Annexure A of this RFP [the B-BBEE Preference Point Claim Form], Tenderers are required to indicate the percentage of the contract that will be sub-contracted as well as the B-BBEE status of the sub-contractor/s.

In addition, tenderers are required to attach a letter from the intended sub-contractor in the event of the Tenderer's appointment.

The last day for submitting queries is 5 (five) days before the closing date of tender.

It should be noted that this e-mail address is not to be used for submission of tender proposals.

- 4.2 Any correspondence with regards to this RFP must be in writing to the provided email address only.
- 4.3 After the closing date of the RFP, a Tenderer may only communicate with the Procurement Unit, specific person for this RFP and/or the PV-SA Tender Administrator on any matter relating to its RFP.



- 4.4 Tenderers are to note that changes to its submission will not be considered after the closing date.
- 4.5 Tenderers are warned that a proposal will be liable to disqualification should any attempt be made by a Tenderer either directly or indirectly to canvass any officer or employee of SFF in respect of this RFP between the closing date and the date of the award of the business.
- 4.6 Furthermore, Tenderers found to be in collusion with one another will be automatically disqualified and restricted from doing business with SFF in the future.

5 INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING THE RFP

- 5.1. Proposals must be submitted in digital electronic format via the National Treasury online eTender Portal (www.etenders.gov.za).
- 5.2 All returnable documents tabled in the Proposal Form [Part 5] must be returned with your proposal.
- 5.3 Unless otherwise expressly stated, all proposals furnished pursuant to this RFP shall be deemed to be offers. Any exceptions to this statement must be clearly and specifically indicated.

6 COMPLIANCE

The successful Tenderer shall be in full and complete compliance with any and all applicable laws and regulations.

7 DISCLAIMERS

Tenderers are hereby advised that SFF is not committed to any course of action as a result of its issuance of this RFP and/or its receipt of Proposals. In particular, please note that SFF reserves the right to:

- 7.1. modify the RFP's Scope of Work and request Tenderers to re-tender on any such changes;
- 7.2. reject any Proposal which does not conform to instructions and scope of work which are detailed herein;
- 7.3. disqualify Proposals submitted after the stated submission deadline [Closing Date];
- 7.4. not necessarily accept the lowest priced Proposal or an alternative Tender;
- 7.5. validate any information submitted by Tenderers in response to this tender. This would include but not limited to, requesting the Tenderer to provide supporting evidence. By submitting a tender, the Tenderer hereby irrevocable grant the necessary consent to SFF to do so;
- 7.6. request audited financial statement or other documentation for the purposes of a due diligence exercise;
- 7.7. award a contract in connection with this Proposal at any time after the RFP's closing date;
- 7.8. award a contract for only a portion of the proposed Services which are reflected in the scope of this RFP;



- 7.9. split the award of the contract between more than one Service Provider, should it at SFF's discretion be more advantageous in terms of, amongst others, cost or developmental considerations;
- 7.10. cancel the tender process.
- 7.11 exclude any Tenderer from the Tendering process who has been found guilty of a serious breach of law during the preceding 5 [five] years, including but not limited to breaches of the Competition Act 89 of 1998. Tenderers are required to declare such serious breach of law during the past 5 [five] years in Part 10 [Breach of Law];
- 7.12 Undertake post-tender negotiations;
- 7.13 award the business to the highest scoring Tenderer/s unless objective criteria justify the award to another Tenderer;
- 7.14 award the business to the next ranked tenderer, provided that he/she is still prepared to provide the required Services at the quoted price, should the preferred tenderer fail to sign or commence with the contract within a reasonable period after being requested to do so. Under such circumstances, the validity of the tenders of the next ranked tenderer(s) will be deemed to remain valid, irrespective of whether the next ranked tenderer(s) were issued with a Letter of Regret. Tenderers may therefore be requested to advise whether they would still be prepared to provide the required Services at their quoted price, even after they have been issued with a Letter of Regret.

Kindly note that SFF association will not reimburse any Tenderer for any preparatory costs or other work performed in connection with its Proposal, whether or not the Tenderer is awarded a contract.

8 LEGAL REVIEW

A Proposal submitted by a Tenderer will be subjected to review and acceptance or rejection of its proposed contractual terms and conditions by SFF Legal Advisor, prior to consideration for an award of business.

9 NATIONAL TREASURY'S CENTRAL SUPPLIER DATABASE

Tenderers are required to self-register on National Treasury's Central Supplier Database ("CSD") which has been established to centrally administer supplier information for all organs of state and facilitate the verification of certain key supplier information. Tenderers must register on the CSD prior to submitting their bids. Business may not be awarded to a Tenderer who has failed to register on the CSD. Only foreign suppliers with no local registered entity need not register on the CSD.

For this purpose, the attached SBD1 form must be completed and submitted as a returnable document by the closing date and time of the bid (ANNEXURE E).

10 TAX COMPLIANCE

Tenderers must be compliant when submitting a proposal to SFF and remain compliant for the entire contract term with all applicable tax legislation, including but not limited to the Income Tax Act, 1962 (Act No. 58 of 1962) and Value Added Tax Act, 1991 (Act No. 89 of 1991).

It is a condition of this tender that the tax matters of the successful Tenderer be in order, or that satisfactory arrangements have been made with South African Revenue Service (SARS) to meet the Tenderer's tax obligations.



The Tax Compliance status requirements are also applicable to foreign Tenderers who wish to submit tenders.

Where Consortia / Joint Ventures / Sub-contractors are involved, each party must be registered on the Central Supplier Database and their tax compliance status will be verified through the Central Supplier Database.

For this purpose, the attached SBD1 form must be completed and submitted as a returnable document by the closing date and time of the bid (Please see ANNEXURE E).

11 PROTECTION OF PERSONAL INFORMATION ACT, NO.4 OF 2013

SFF association acknowledges that the Tenderer may be required to process the personal information of SFF association and other relevant data subjects in connection with and for the purposes of this RFP.

The Tenderer shall-

- (a) only process such personal information for the purpose connected with this RFP, except to the extent specifically requested to do otherwise by SFF association in writing or required by the Protection of Personal Information Act, No.4 of 2013 (POPI) or other applicable laws;
- (b) comply with all directions and instructions which may be given by SFF association regarding the processing of such personal information;
- (c) only process personal information strictly in compliance with POPI;
- (d) secure the integrity and confidentiality of the personal information it processes pursuant to this RFP by taking appropriate, reasonably technical and organisational measures to prevent
 - (i) loss of, damage to, or unauthorised destruction of such personal information; and/or
 - (ii) unlawful access to or unlawful processing of such personal information.

The Tenderer shall be liable to SFF for its failure to comply with any of its obligations, and shall indemnify SFF against all claims, damages, costs or administrative fines arising from the Tenderer's failure to comply with POPI, except to the extent caused by SFF association.

In evaluating the Tenderer's tender submission, the SFF will process the personal information of the Tenderer and other relevant data subjects in connection with and for the purposes of this RFP. The SFF shall process personal information in accordance with SFF's Privacy Policy which is available on the SFF website — the Tenderer is expected to familiar itself with this Privacy Policy. The SFF reserves the right and the Tenderer is hereby informed that external service providers may be appointed by the SFF to assist SFF in evaluating tender responses and suitability for appointment.



PART 2. BACKGROUND, OVERVIEW AND SCOPE OF REQUIREMENTS

12 BACKGROUND AND SCOPE OF WORK

12.1 Introduction

RFP number SFF/2023/1A/NOE/SP#3 is for a Tenderer, referred to as the Tenderer in this document, to carry out an ESIA referred to as 'Sub-Project#3: ESIA for the Jonglei sub-basin in Block B2, South Sudan'.

South Africa's state-owned Strategic Fuel Fund ("SFF") signed an Exploration and Production Sharing Agreement (EPSA) with the Ministry of Petroleum, South Sudan government, in May 2019. Under this agreement, SFF will carry out E&P activities in Block B2 in partnership with South Sudan's national oil company, Nile Petroleum Corp (carried partner).

EPSA states: "As part of the Minimum Work Obligation and expenditures: SFF will carry out an Environmental Baseline study (EBS) and Environment and Social Impact Assessment (ESIA) for seismic acquisition"

As part of this obligation, SFF requires the Tenderer to carry out the Sub-Project#3 ESIA and EBS which will include tasks such as field soil sampling, laboratory analyses of surface water samples, data interpretation and community engagement.

12.2 Project Description

The South Sudan Environmental Legislation, Land Act of 2009 states Project proponents must Conduct an ESIA before undertaking any activity that might affect people or the environment

The ESIA is required prior to commencement of field-based petroleum exploration activities to be carried out at and/or near ground surface. SFF will only accept ESIA proposals that at least address the basic requirements set out by the relevant Ministerial authorities of South Sudan. As such, SFF is seeking a Tenderer that can demonstrate capability in conducting ESIA's in the African region in general and preferably within South Sudan. Preference will be given to Tenderer's who propose to carry out the ESIA in conjunction with local South Sudan environmental consultancies while also engaging local students to facilitate local knowledge transfer.

12.3 Project Area and Location


Licence Block B2 is located in the south-eastern portion of South Sudan and extends over an area of approximately 48,000 sq-km (please see location map below).





Location Map Showing Licence Block B2 in South Sudan

The licence block has a moderate topographic setting as illustrated below on a digital elevation map (DEM). The DEM also shows the licence block boundary (red polygon) and ESIA survey area (black dotted polyline), the proposed ESIA area, the programme surveys and the main physiographic zones that in occur in the Jonglei area with Bor being the nearest major town in the ESIA study area. The Area of interest (AOI) terrain is mainly flat and subjected to seasonal flooding of the White Nile River. It consists of swamps (20%) and flood plains (80%).



Digital Elevation Map With Block B2 Licence Boundary in Red and Smaller ESIA Survey Area Indicated With Black Dotted Polyline




12.4 Scope of Work and Need for ESIA Studies

For the fulfilment of the EPSA responsibilities and commitments in licence Block B2 in South Sudan, SFF plans to develop a geological model together with an understanding of the petroleum systems in the licence area as part of exploration risk mitigation. This process will assist in scaling down and delineating petroleum exploration target areas.

Key technical exploration tasks include new seismic data acquisition and soil micro-seepage sampling within the Jonglei sub-basin in Block B2, South Sudan (please see study area map below). New infill 2D seismic lines (red lines) will serve to supplement data from a legacy seismic survey acquired in 2006 (blue lines), while some of the new infill seismic lines are also planned in the virgin northern portion of the licence block. Seismic survey activity will involve multi-metre deep shot point holes and dynamite explosives as a sound source with rows of surface receivers spaced at 10's of metres apart. Soil microseep sampling is planned at approximately 1 km intervals along both new and legacy seismic lines. This will involve shallow auger drill sampling of soil horizons down to a few metres in depth. Overlap of the soil sample points with the seismic lines will minimize environmental disturbance. The overall proposed study area extends across approximately 8,620 sq-km. Further relevant details regarding these technical studies will be provided if after an intention to bid is indicated.

These field-based activities are aimed at obtaining new data to help define the subsurface basin architecture and structure while also providing evidence for a working petroleum system. Ultimately, this will contribute to making more informed exploration decisions that are cost effective and efficient.

Importantly, SFF recognizes both the need for obtaining a comprehensive ESIA that is relevant to both the seismic data acquisition and microseep soil sampling exploration prior to commencement of any ground survey for safe and sustainable exploration activities of benefit to all stakeholders including local communities.

Tenderer's need to indicate their capabilities in terms of providing relevant ESIA services working in conjunction with reputable licensed local partner consultancy\ies using accredited laboratories and analytical equipment. Also, personnel experience need to be indicated with regards to conducting Environmental Baseline Study's (EBS) and Environment Social Impact Assessments (ESIA), to predict and evaluate potential environmental impacts in oil & gas prospective areas due to Geophysical, Reservoir and Petroleum activities before seismic survey and soil sampling activities are performed.



The Tenderer must familiarize themselves with South Sudan's regulations of the Ministry of Petroleum, the Ministry of Environment, and the Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry, Co-operatives and Rural Development.

The proposed ESIA Methodology needs to be clearly outlined together with standards and conformity to local laws and regulations whilst also following good international practice. Aspects to be described include Data Gathering and Scoping, The Assessment Process, Risk Mitigation & Management, Stakeholder Consultations & Public Engagement, Field Surveys, Environmental Management Plan, Evaluation of any requirements for UXO/ ERW work and Security liaison as the Tenderer will be required to provide their own security team.

13 PLANNED PROJECT ACTIVITIES AND WORK EXECUTION PLAN

Tenderer must submit a description of planned project activities including a Project Execution Plan (PEP), which will provide details of the specific activities in the project, the resources applied to the project, and the organization of the project. The major elements of a project execution plan are:

- Scope Definition
- Project scheduling
- Timelines as per deliverables (Milestones)
- Quality and technical specifications
- Resource allocation
- Safety and Environmental Management System

14 ESIA REPORT STRUCTURE

The ESIA report sections need to include at least the following:

14.1 Baseline Description

Tenderer must submit a description of the following planned baseline survey tasks:

- Biophysical environment (i.e. physical that includes unexploded ordinances (UXO) and biological environments)
- Socio-economic environment

14.2 Impact Identification, Evaluation, Analysis and Prediction

Tenderer must submit a description of how environmental and social impact identification, evaluation, analysis and prediction will be carried out.

14.3 Public Consultation

Tenderer must submit a public consultation plan relevant to the proposed exploration activities.

14.4 Mitigation Measures

Based upon knowledge and experience, the Tenderer must list and describe mitigation measures that relate to likely risks in the study area.

14.5 Assessment of Alternatives

Tenderer must submit a list of alternate and contingent action plans.



14.6 Environmental Management Plan (EMP)

Tenderer must describe their EMP strategy and methodology relevant to the proposed exploration activities and study area.

14.7 Monitoring Plan

A detailed monitoring plan must be submitted by the Tenderer.

14.8 Annexes

A list of the following annexes need to be included:

- References
- Resettlement Action Plan (RAP) if any
- Compensation Plan

16 POLICY, LEGAL AND INSTITUTIONAL FRAMEWORK & STANDARD TERMS AND CONDITIONS

16.1 Duration

This agreement shall commence and be effective on the date of signature (the Commencement Date) and shall continue unless terminated earlier in accordance with the terms of this agreement.

16.2 Milestone / Payment Schedule

Disbursements and transactions will be in South African Rand (ZAR) in a phased manner as per successful completion of pre-agreed milestones and percentages of total cost of Sub-Project#03.

- Milestone #1: On signature of contract (10% payment)
- Milestone #2: On successful collection and analysis of soil and water samples (20% payment)
- Milestone #3: On successful completion of baseline survey and reporting (30% payment)
- Milestone #4: On successful completion of social survey and reporting (20% payment)
- Milestone #5: On delivery of final ESIA in acceptable format for submission to the MoP (20% payment)



16.3 Prioritised Area\s for the ESIA

SFF shall within five (5) days of the Commencement Date submit to the Tenderer a list of geographic coordinates and accompanying maps depicting area\s, to be prioritized for ESIA work. The Tenderer shall first carry out the ESIA services over the prioritized area\s before commencing such services over the remainder of the survey area, subject to logistical constraints and unless directed otherwise by SFF's Representative (PV-SA).

16.6 **SFF** <u>responsibilities</u>:

SFF is responsible for the following:

- Assistance in procuring field work permits and landowner permissions required for the performance of the project
- Notifying military, local communities and all other required parties
- Office space with electricity and internet for the Tenderer's staff at SFF's compound in Juba if required by Tenderer
- Assistance in preparation of visas for the Tenderer's staff
- SFF will also initiate and maintain appropriate security measures and contingency plans in collaboration with the South Sudan Police, National Security Service and private security management personnel to prevent any security breaches or violations against contracted personnel, infrastructure, equipment, facilities and operations.



16.7 <u>Insurance</u>

- Tenderer shall provide, maintain and pay for the following insurance coverage:
 - General liability insurance for bodily injury, death and damage to property including loss of use thereof, and without restricting the generality of the foregoing, such coverage shall include contractual liability, delictual/tortious liability, contractor's protective liability and products and completed operations liability. Such insurance shall be in the name of the Tenderer and shall extend to and cover all acts of the Tenderer, its officers and employees, including any contractors retained by the Tenderer in terms of this agreement;
 - Equipment liability insurance covering all equipment used by the Tenderer in connection with the performance of the Services for appropriate amount hereunder covering public liability, and property damage liability; and
 - Employer's liability insurance, which covers each employee (including contract staff of companies contracted by the Tenderer) of the Tenderer engaged in providing the Services hereunder where such employee is not covered by Workers' Compensation.
- Tenderer shall maintain, provide and pay for all risks insurance covering Tenderer's machinery and equipment used by it in the performance of the Services.
- From time to time, any additional insurance which the Tenderer is of the opinion is required for the performance of the Services shall be obtained by the Tenderer at its own cost and expense.
- All insurance required by this clause shall be and remain in full force and effect during the time in which the Tenderer is performing the Services and finally leaving South Sudan.

16.8 Breach By Either Party

If either Party breaches any provision of this agreement, then the aggrieved Party shall give the other Party notice of such breach, and should the other Party fail to remedy such breach within seven (7) days of the receipt of notice, then the aggrieved Party shall be entitled at such Party's option to convene a meeting between the Parties upon a further seven (7) days written notice to discuss and attempt to resolve the breach. If such meeting cannot resolve the breach to the satisfaction of the aggrieved Party or if the other Party refuse to attend the meeting despite receipt of written notice thereof, the aggrieved Party may institute arbitration proceedings immediately for enforcement of the terms of this agreement or, alternatively and without further notice, to declare this agreement cancelled, all of which may be done without prejudice to any claim the aggrieved Party may have in law for damages arising from breach of contract or any other cause.

16.9 Termination By SFF

SFF may at any time terminate this agreement by giving the Tenderer 60 (Sixty) days written notice of its intention to terminate this agreement. In such a case, the Tenderer shall be entitled to be paid for all the work actually undertaken by it, and to be reimbursed for any expense the Tenderer reasonably incurred by it, up to the date of termination.

16.10 Force Majeure

- No failure by either party to perform in accordance within the provisions of this Agreement shall constitute a breach of this Agreement if the failure arising is from Force Majeure
- "Events of Force Majeure" mean but are not limited to acts of: God, war, insurrection, riot, orders or regulations of any civil, military or governmental authority, civil commotion, strikes, lockouts, labour disputes, fire, weather, theft, explosions, earthquakes, lightning strikes, floods; unforeseen delays in acquiring and/or transporting material, equipment and fuel; actions and requisition by Public Authorities, pandemic, USA government redirection of GPS satellites or laws, sun spot disturbances affecting GPS satellites, and any other causes whether or not similar to the foregoing and beyond the control of the parties, except financial events, which precludes the performance of either Party's obligations pursuant to this agreement for such period of Force Majeure



- In event of Force Majeure occurrence, Tenderer and SFF shall promptly notify each other, giving full
 particulars thereof, and shall use their best efforts to remedy such failures of fulfilment with all
 reasonable dispatch. Tenderer and SFF shall continue to keep the other party fully advised of the
 progress being made in such efforts
- If the Project is terminated because of Force Majeure, the cost of all surveying successfully completed to the satisfaction of the Client, shall be borne by the Client. The Client will not be liable to pay any stand-by charges

- 1.2 The Contractor accepts, in terms of the General Conditions of Contract and in terms of the Act, his obligations as an employer in respect of all persons in his employ, other persons on the premises or the Site or place of work or on the work to be executed by him, and under his control. He shall, before commencement with the execution of the contract work, comply with the provisions set out in the Act, and shall implement and maintain a Health and Safety Plan as described in the Construction Regulations, 2003 and as approved by SFF, on the Site and place of work for the duration of the Contract.
- 1.3 The Contractor accepts his obligation to complying fully with the Act and applicable Regulations notwithstanding the omission of some of the provisions of the Act and the Regulations from this document.
- 1.4 SFF accepts, in terms of the Act, its obligations as an employer of its own employees working on or associated with the site or place of work, and the Contractor and Procurement Manager / SHEQ Manager / Technical Manager or his deputy shall at all times, co-operate in respect of the health and safety management of the site, and shall agree on the practical arrangements and procedures to be implemented and maintained during execution of the Works.
- 1.5 In the event of any discrepancies between any legislation and this specification, the applicable legislation will take precedence.

2. Definitions

- 2.1 In this Specification any word or expression to which a meaning has been assigned in the Construction Regulations, shall have the meaning so assigned to it, unless the context otherwise indicates: -
- 2.2 "competent person" in relation to construction work, means any person having the knowledge, training and experience specific to the work or task being performed:
 Provided that where appropriate qualifications and training are registered as per the South African Qualifications Authority Act, 1995 these qualifications and training shall be deemed to be the required qualifications and training;
- 2.4 **"contractor"** means principal contractor and "subcontractor" means contractor as defined by the Construction Regulations, 2003.
- 2.5 **"fall protection plan"** means a documented plan, of all risks relating to working from an elevated position, considering the nature of work undertaken, and setting out the procedures and methods applied to eliminate the risk;
- 2.6 **"health and safety file"** means a file or other record in permanent form, containing the information required to be kept on site in accordance with the Act and applicable Regulations;



- 2.7 **"Health and Safety Plan"** means a documented plan which addresses the hazards identified and include safe work procedures to mitigate, reduce or control the hazards identified;
- 2.8 **"Risk Assessment"** means a programme to determine any risk associated with any hazard at a construction site, in order to identify the steps needed to be taken to remove, reduce or control such hazard;
- 2.9 "the Act" means the Occupational Health and Safety Act No. 85 of 1993.
- 3. The Contractor shall, in accordance with the Act and applicable Regulations, make all the necessary appointments of competent persons in writing on a form similar to Annexure 2 of this Specification and deliver copies thereof to the Procurement Manager / SHEQ Manager / Technical Manager. Copies should also be retained on the health and safety file.
- 3.1 Subcontractors shall also make the above written appointments and the Contractor shall deliver copies thereof to the Procurement Manager / SHEQ Manager / Technical Manager.
- 3.2 In the case of a self-employed Contractor or any subcontractor who has the appropriate competencies and supervises the work himself, the appointment of a construction supervisor in terms of regulation 6.1 of the Construction Regulations, 2003 will not be necessary. The Contractor shall in such a case execute and sign a declaration, as in Annexure 3, by which he personally undertakes the duties and obligations of the "Chief Executive Officer" in terms of section 16(1) of the Act.
- 3.3 The Contractor shall, before commencing any work, obtain from the Procurement Manager / SHEQ Manager / Technical Manager an access certificate as in Annexure 4 executed and signed by him, permitting and limiting access to the designated site or place of work by the Contractor and any subcontractors under his control.
- 3.4 Procedural compliance with Act and Regulations, as above, shall also apply to any subcontractors as employers in their own right. The Contractor shall furnish the Procurement Manager / SHEQ

Manager / Technical Manager with full particulars of such subcontractors and shall ensure that they comply with the Act and Regulations and safety requirements and procedures.

4. Special Permits

Where special permits are required before work may be carried out such as for hot work, isolation permits, work permits and occupations, the Contractor shall apply to the Procurement Manager / SHEQ Manager / Technical Manager or the relevant authority for such permits to be issued. The Contractor shall strictly comply with the conditions and requirements pertaining to the issue of such permits.

5. Health and Safety Programme

- 5.1 The Tenderer shall, with his tender, submit a Health and Safety Programme setting out the practical arrangements and procedures to be implemented by him to ensure compliance by him with the Act and Regulations and particularly in respect of: -
 - (i) The provision, as far as is reasonably practical, of a working environment that is safe and without risk to the health of his employees and subcontractors in terms of section 8 of the Act;



- (ii) the execution of the contract work in such a manner as to ensure in terms of section 9 of the Act that persons other than those in the Contractor's employment, who may be directly affected by the contract work are not thereby exposed to hazards to their health and safety;
- (iv) ensuring, as far as is reasonably practical, in terms of section 37 of the Act that no employee or subcontractor of the Contractor does or omits to do any act which would be an offence for the Contractor to do or omit to do.
- 5.2 The Contractor's Health and Safety Programme shall be based on a risk assessment in respect of the hazards to health and safety of his employees and other persons under his control that are associated with or directly affected by the Contractor's activities in performing the contract work and shall establish precautionary measures as are reasonable and practical in protecting the safety and health of such employees and persons.
- 5.3 The Contractor shall cause a risk assessment contemplated in clause 5.2 above to be performed by a competent person, appointed in writing, before commencement of any **Construction Work** and reviewed during construction. The Risk Assessments shall form part of the Health and Safety programme to be applied on the site and shall include at least the following:
- The identification of the risks and hazards that persons may be exposed to;
- the analysis and evaluation of the hazards identified;
- a documented Health and Safety Plan, including safe work procedures to mitigate, reduce or control the risks identified;
- a monitoring and review plan.
- 5.4 The Health and Safety Plan shall include full particulars in respect of: -
- The safety management structure to be instituted on site or place of work and the names of the Contractor's health and safety representatives and members of safety committees where applicable;
- the safe working methods and procedures to be implemented to ensure the work is performed in compliance with the Act and Regulations;
- the safety equipment, devices and clothing to be made available by the Contractor to his employees;
- he site access control measures pertaining to health and safety to be implemented;
- The introduction of control measures for ensuring that the Safety Plan is maintained and monitored for the duration of the Contract.
- 5.5 The Health and Safety programme shall be subject to the Procurement Manager / SHEQ Manager / Technical Manager's approval and he may, in consultation with the Contractor, order that additional and/or supplementary practical arrangements and procedures be implemented and maintained by the Contractor or that different working methods or safety equipment be used or safety clothes be issued which, in the Procurement Manager / SHEQ Manager / Technical Manager's opinion, are necessary to ensure full compliance by the Contractor with his obligations as an employer in terms



- of the Act and Regulations. The Procurement Manager / SHEQ Manager / Technical Manager or his deputy shall be allowed to attend meetings of the Contractor's safety committee as an observer.
- 5.6 The Contractor shall take reasonable steps to ensure that each subcontractor's Health and Safety Plan is implemented and maintained on the construction site: Provided that the steps taken shall include periodic audits at intervals mutually agreed to between the them, but at least once every month.
- 5.7 The Contractor shall stop any subcontractor from executing any construction work, which is not in accordance with the Contractor's, and/or subcontractor's Health and Safety Plan for the site or which poses a threat to the health and safety of persons.
- 5.8 The Contractor shall ensure that a copy of the Health and Safety Plan is available on site for inspection by an inspector, Procurement Manager / SHEQ Manager / Technical Manager, agent, subcontractor, employee, registered employee organization, health and safety representative or any member of the health and safety committee.
- 5.9 The Contractor shall consult with the health and safety committee or, if no health and safety committee exists, with a representative group of employees, on the development, monitoring and review of the Risk Assessment.
- 5.10 The Contractor shall ensure that all employees under his control are informed, instructed and trained by a competent person regarding any hazard and the related work procedures before any work commences, and thereafter at such times as may be determined in the Risk Assessment.
- 5.11 The Contractor shall ensure that all subcontractors are informed regarding any hazard as stipulated in the Risk Assessment before any work commences, and thereafter at such times as may be determined in the Risk Assessment.
- 5.12 The Contractor shall ensure that all visitors to a construction site undergoes health and safety induction pertaining to the hazards prevalent on the site and shall be provided with the necessary personal protective equipment.

6. Fall Protection Plan

- 6.1 In the event of the risk and hazard identification, as required in terms of clause 5.3 of this Specification, revealing risks relating to working from an elevated position the contractor shall cause the designation of a competent person, responsible for the preparation of a fall protection plan;
- 6.2 The Contractor shall implement, maintain and monitor the fall protection plan for the duration of Contract. The Contractor shall also take such steps to ensure the continued adherence to the fall protection plan.
- 6.3 The fall protection plan shall include: -
 - A Risk Assessment of all work carried out from an elevated position;
 - The procedures and methods to address all the identified risks per location;
 - The evaluation of the employees' physical and psychological fitness necessary to work at elevated positions;



- The training of employees working from elevated positions; and
- The procedure addressing the inspection, testing and maintenance of all fall protection equipment.

7. Hazards and Potential Hazardous Situations

The Contractor and the Procurement Manager / SHEQ Manager / Technical Manager shall immediately notify one another of any hazardous or potentially hazardous situations which may arise during performance of the Contract by the Contractor or any subcontractor and, in particular, of such hazards as may be caused by the design, execution and/or location and any other aspect pertaining to the contract work.

8. Health and Safety File

- 8.1 The Contractor shall ensure that a health and safety file is opened and kept on site and shall include all documentation required as per the Act and applicable regulations, and made available to an inspector, the Procurement Manager / SHEQ Manager / Technical Manager, or subcontractor upon request.
- 8.2 The Contractor shall ensure that a copy of the both his Health and Safety Plan as well as any subcontractor's Health and Safety Plan is available on request to an employee, inspector, contractor or the Procurement Manager / SHEQ Manager / Technical Manager.
- 8.3 The Contractor shall hand over a consolidated health and safety file to the Procurement Manager / SHEQ Manager / Technical Manager upon completion of the **Works** and shall in addition to documentation mentioned in the Act and applicable Regulations include a record of all drawings, designs, materials used and other similar information concerning the completed structure.

HSE philosophy

Inherent safety and protection of the environment is a prerequisite from the beginning of the design process. The HSE philosophy must be included in the design premise document, and should include considerations on waste reduction, minimisation of fugitive emissions, ground water pollution prevention, minimisation of manning levels for hazardous processes, hazardous materials handling, early detection systems and specific measures to reduce risks to ALARP levels.

Hazard identification study

A systematic evaluation of all hazards shall be performed in the hazard study. The hazard study is the basis for the area classification drawings and may alter the location of for example buildings, process units on the plot plan or may lead to additional preventive measures (firewalls, other material types etc) being required.
